

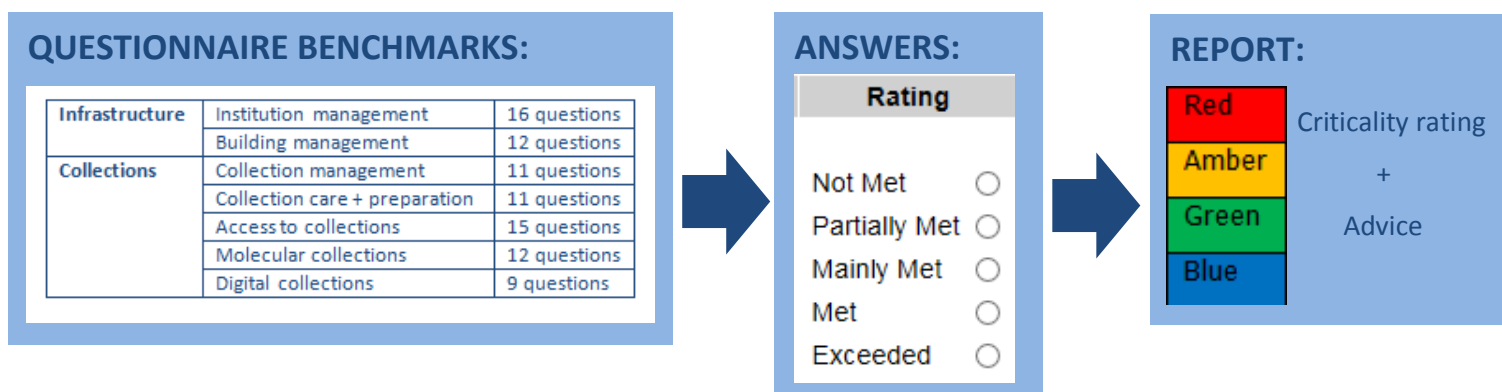
## Collections Self-Assessment Tool

### What's it all about?

- a simple-to-use, online self-assessment for collections-holding institutions
- questions cover infrastructure (institution and building management) and collections (management, care, access, molecular and digital)
- identifies areas for improvement and provides advice on where improved standards can be adopted
- provides valuable information that institutions can use in planning, management and in seeking funding
- allows SYNTHESYS to identify collection management needs across Europe and beyond

### What is involved?

- nominate an individual to register and act as the main contact point
- complete the questionnaire via tickbox answers either at department or institution level.
- approx. 2-3 days for data gathering and a couple of hours to enter the results
- results are submitted online to the SYNTHESYS administration.
- contact person receives a report summarising results including recommendations for improving any areas which do not meet the benchmark level

To date, **43** institutions from **22** countries are using the tool.

Institutions who have already completed the self-assessment are encouraged to re-use it to test whether collections management is improving.
